Outpatient Programs

Intensive Outpatient Program

The intensive outpatient program offers a minimum of nine (9) hours of treatment services per week. This is provided in a structured group environment offered three days a week that utilizes an evidenced based program. The staff provides a safe confidential setting to help assist the client in moving towards a healthy sober lifestyle. There is a focus on Early Recovery Skills, Relapse Prevention and Family Education.

Extended Outpatient Program

The extended outpatient program offers a minimum of one (1) hour up to eight (8) hours of treatment services per week which can include:

Extended Outpatient Group: Provides regularly scheduled weekly groups that address lifestyle, attitude and behavioral issues which undermine the individual's ability to cope without the use of alcohol or drugs.

Adolescent Outpatient Group: Provides regularly scheduled groups two days a week. An evidenced based curriculum specific to adolescents is utilized. Adolescents learn to work and think on their own as they strive to change high-risk behaviors.

Individual Counseling: Provides regularly scheduled individual session. The focus of these sessions are individualized to address specific area of need to include the use of substances and the effects they have on personal life and that of the family.

Continuing Care: Provides ongoing support and preparation for discharge following more extensive treatment in group and individual settings.

Integrated Provider Network -Substance Use Disorder Prevention & Treatment Services

The Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) Substance Use and Problem Gambling Services Integrated Provider Network (IPN) is a statewide, community-based, resiliency- and recovery-oriented system of care for substance use and problem gambling services (prevention, early intervention, treatment, and recovery support).

New Opportunities, Inc. is part of the IDPH Integrated Provider Network, with services funded by the Iowa Department of Public Health and the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).
