## WIC-Approved Foods

- Infants—If mom is not breastfeeding, ironfortified formula is provided for the baby. When baby is old enough, baby foods and plain cereal are available.
- Breastfeeding moms— Moms who breastfeed qualify to receive milk, cheese, yogurt, juice, cereal, eggs, peanut butter/beans, tuna/salmon, whole wheat bread, fruits and vegetables.
- Children 1-5 years old Children 1-5 are able to receive milk, cheese, yogurt, juice, cereal, eggs, peanut butter or beans, whole wheat bread, fruits and vegetables.

## **Benefits of WIC**

- WIC provides health services including nutrition education, breastfeeding promotion and support, eWIC cards to buy nutritious food, immunization screening and referrals, and health and social services referrals.
- WIC nurses and dietitians provide nutrition counseling and help you determine what foods are approved and what stores accept WIC.
- Food packages are available to fit the needs of all new and expectant moms who qualify.

I-Smile™ is a dental home initiative that helps lowa children connect with dental services. Staff provide oral screenings, fluoride varnish, counseling and dental education, and link families with a dental home. The I-Smile™ program is a result of legislation passed in 2005 stating that every child under 12 that receives medical assistance shall have a dental home where dental screenings and preventative care are obtained. In 2021, New Opportunities I-Smile Program provided 2,683 oral health services to 740 children residing in Audubon,

Carroll, and Guthrie counties. These services included 860 dental screenings and 769 fluoride varnishes.
