<u>Education</u>: Using a variety of learning experiences to help children grow intellectually, socially, and emotionally.


<u>Health</u>: Providing health services such as immunizations, dental, medical health, mental health, nutritional services, and early detection of health problems.

<u>Parent Involvement:</u> Parents serve on policy councils and committees that make administrative decisions, participate in classes on child development, and volunteer in the Head Start program.

Social Services: Head Start provides outreach to families to determine what services would be beneficial.
