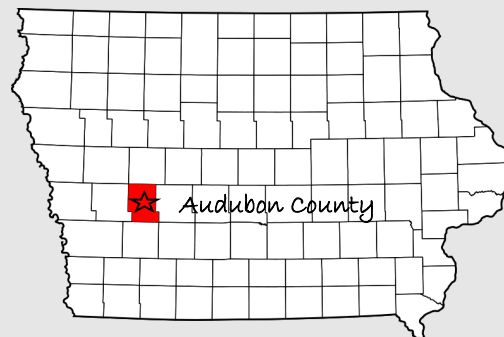

The assistance is based on household income, household size, type of fuel, and type of housing.
