Vehicles that stretched for blocks traveled past New Hope Village, Carroll senior-living facilities and St. Anthony Regional Hospital on Cruise for a Cause parade Friday, May 15. The parade, part of a special col-

lection campaign for New Opportunities' food pantry, had been scheduled for Saturday, May 9, but was postponed because of threatening weather that evening. However, the collection did go on that evening and brought in more than 1,200 pounds of food items and \$6,100.

Brian Brauckman, who's promoted weekly Saturday night cruises on Highway 30 and the Cruise for a Cause on his Facebook page, said of the parade, "Everything turned out great. They turned out with a wide variety of vehicles. It was really cool to see a bunch of different stuff — even

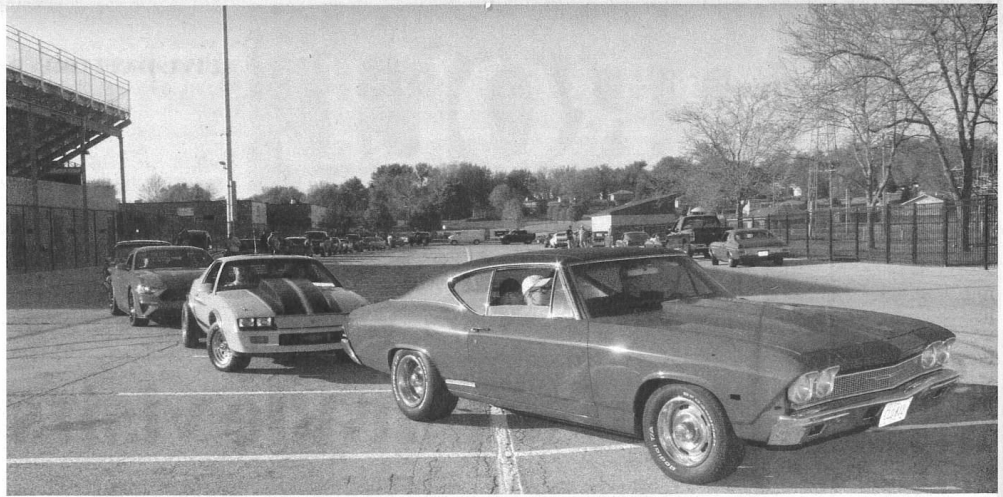

"Thanks to everybody who came out and has been coming out and cruising on the weekends," he said. "They've

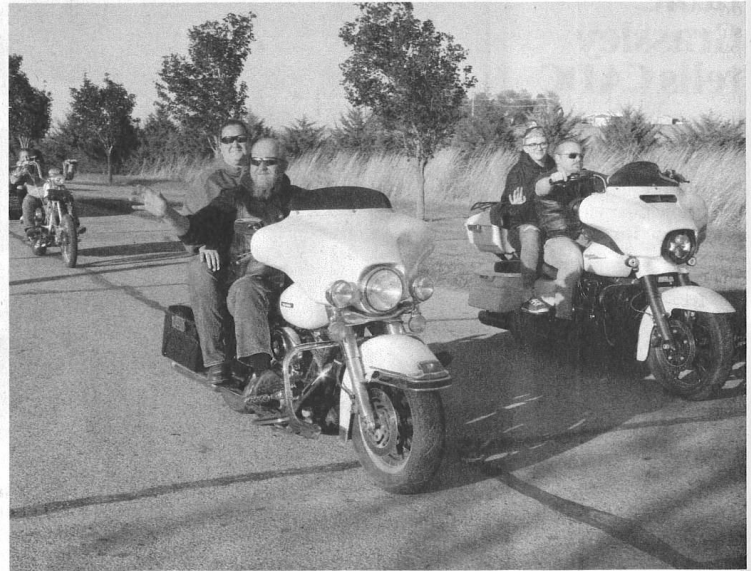
